Dear Ms. Shipman:

I am making application for a permit with the U.S. Department of the Army, Corps of Engineers, Savannah District. I understand that the issuance of such a permit will not relieve me of the obligation to obtain authorization from the State of Georgia since the proposed project would constitute an encroachment on the beds of tidewaters which are State-owned property. Accordingly, I hereby request that I be granted a revocable license from the State of Georgia. Attached hereto and made a part of this request is a copy of the plans and description of the project which will be the subject of such a license.

I understand that if permission from the State is granted, it will be a revocable license and will not constitute a license coupled with an interest. I further acknowledge that such a license would relate only to the property interests of the State and would not obviate the necessity of obtaining any other State license, permit or authorization required by State law.

I recognize that I waive my right of expectation of privacy and I do not have the permission of the State of Georgia to proceed with such project until a copy of this request has been signed by Commissioner Holcomb.

The State of Georgia hereby grants you a revocable license not coupled with an interest as provided in your request. This area may now or in the future be utilized by boats employing power drawn nets under the provisions for commercial or sport bait shrimping.

In its occupancy and use of the premises, licensee shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, gender, color, national origin, religion, age, or disability. This covenant by licensee may be enforced by termination of this license, by injunction, and by any other remedy available at law to the Department. The project proposed for this license must be completed within 3 years of the date of issuance of the license. Otherwise, action will be initiated to revoke the license.

Dear Mr. Gane and Mr. Wynn,

We are submitting the following and enclosed material as an application for a permit from the DNR to place a removable line of bamboo along a creek in the marsh near an extended dock built by Mark Dana in 2007.

We want to do this in order to offer some protection to the now very sensitive marsh area, including creeks, that has been greatly affected by the large accumulation of marsh wrack last summer in relation to this dock. A part of this area has been somewhat reclaimed by our 5 month effort last summer to remove wrack from covering the marsh. We escorted the wrack out by hand, past the dock and into open marsh area where it could be dispersed naturally. More wrack accumulation this season would greatly impede the rejuvenation and reclamation of this fragile area.

We had some success last summer with the removable placement of unattached bamboo poles to deflect the rafting wrack from a small area of upland marsh. That marsh is still alive today compared to nearby areas that no longer have any healthy marsh grass. These poles can be placed into the marsh by boat and easily removed on given notice.

The month of May traditionally brings seasonal high springing tides and the beginning of the seasonal movement of rafts of dead marsh grass, wrack, along the coast. Our calendar indicates these tides may occur on May 3-8, 2008. We would like to have the bamboo in place before these seasonal tides. We will not place any bamboo poles in navigable waters nor will there be any connections or connectors between poles.

Following an existing creek line with this placement would allow the creek itself to act as a flushing agent and use the energy of the tidal flow as a source of removal of any accumulated wrack. We also plan to help escort any accumulation along the poles out into open marsh, but will be greatly helped by the wrack not being wedged into the tight corner created by the 980' dock.


Enclosed are photos from last years wrack accumulation and the area protected by the bamboo. Also, a aerial photo of the marsh with indications of where the bamboo would be placed.



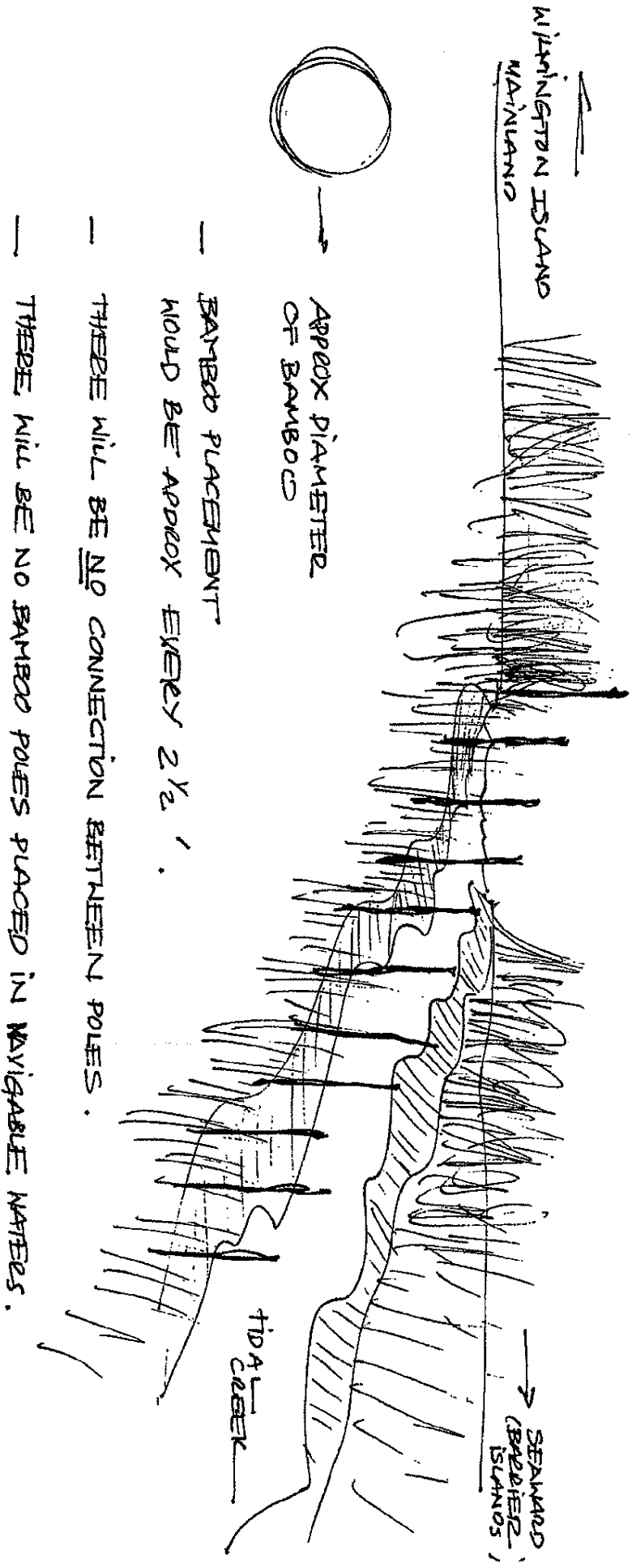

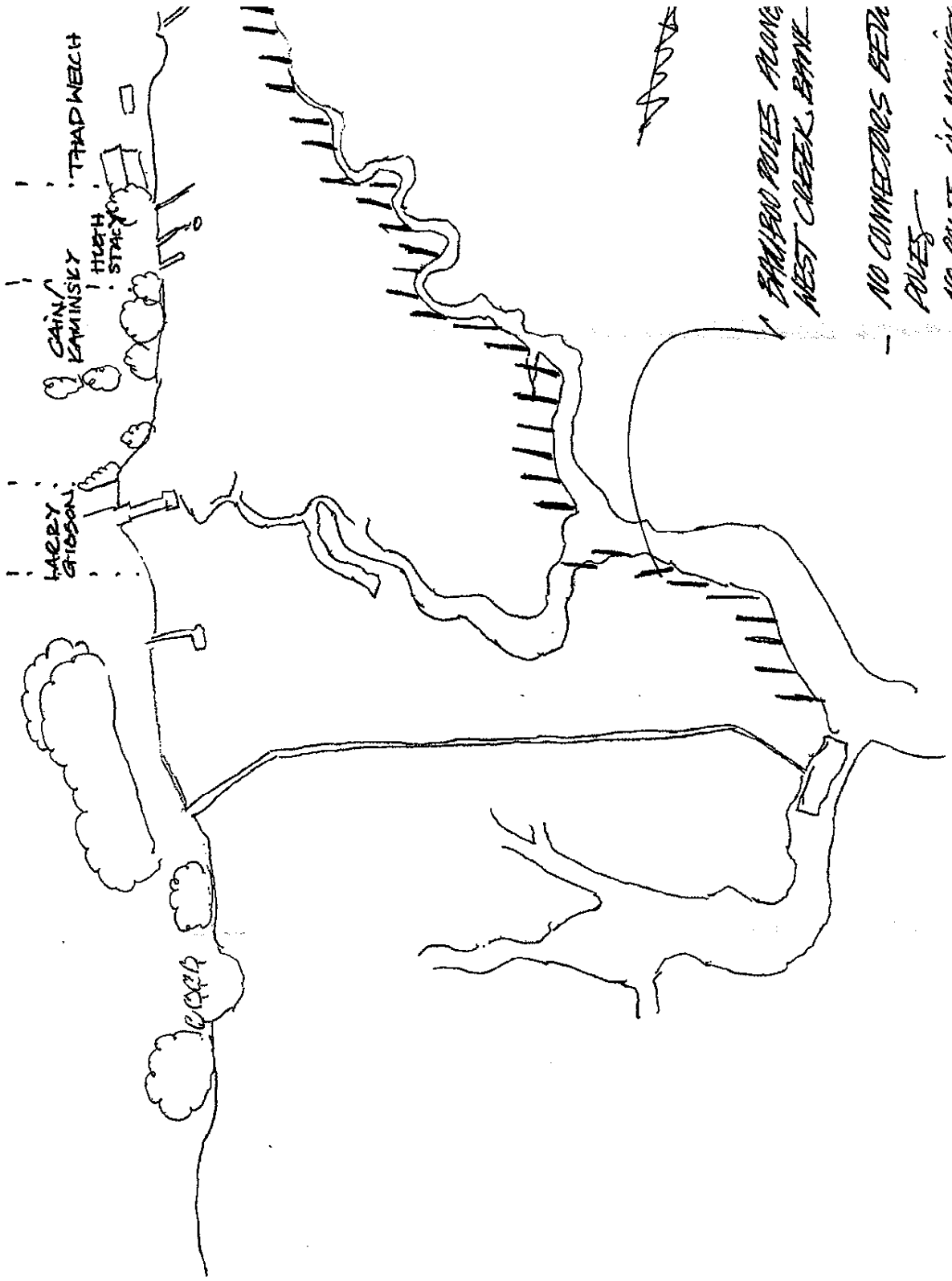


CREEK
